Stewardship

Today's readings remind us that stewardship is not merely something we do--it is at the core of who we are as disciples of Christ.

The first reading contains this prophecy of Christ "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shown." We are among those blessed people on whom the light of Christ has shone. By virtue of our Baptism, we who were once in the darkness of original sin have been reborn into the light that is God's grace within us.

What a privilege! Yet with this privilege comes the responsibility to live for God and to share His Good News with those we meet. In other words, to live as His good stewards.

In the Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus says, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." In other words, this is God's call to live as His disciples, his faithful stewards.

From the desk of the DRE:

Have you ever been to, or watched on TV, a Presidential inauguration? Or the coronation of a king or queen? These are modern instances of a transition of leadership, the close of one person’s governance, and the beginning of another’s.

Jesus’ baptism was, in a sense, such a transition. John the Baptist marked the closing of the Old Testament age of the prophets, just as much as he prepared the way for the New Testament age of the incarnate Christ. Jesus was baptized by John and anointed by the Holy Spirit, but the final stage of this transition was still in progress.

In this Sunday’s Gospel, we see Jesus more fully assuming his Messianic role. First, he hears that John had been arrested. He was decreasing in fame and influence among the people. In response, Jesus withdraws to Galilee. From the somewhat obscure town of Capernaum, he assumes the roles John had formerly had: the calling of disciples and the preaching of repentance. While John was decreasing, Jesus was increasing. A transition of leadership in salvation history.

Jesus takes up John’s exact message—“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand” (compare Matthew 3:2 and 4:17)—but Jesus imbues the exhortation with a whole new meaning, because he *himself* makes the kingdom of heaven present *in his person*. And in the word, “repent,” he is telling his hearers (including us) that it’s time for yet *another* transition—this one in our own, individual lives. It’s time to move from selfishness to selflessness. It’s time to turn away from darkness and toward the light. It’s time to transition from death to life.

As it’s a new calendar year and a time for new beginnings, why not take the next step of repentance in your own life? Maybe that means expanding your daily prayers. Maybe it means committing to Mass at least once a week or more. Maybe it means giving more of your resources to help others, especially the poor. Maybe it means going to Confession more regularly. Whatever it may mean for you, I am confident that when we commit to turning away from ourselves and toward the Lord and others, we begin to fulfill what we pray for every time we say an “Our Father”—“Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.” And when that happens, the light begins to dawn—in your life, in your family, in our community, in our nation, and in our world. And the inauguration of that light far outshines the rule of any earthly king, queen, or president!
